

- In 1962, the Soviets sent ballistic missiles with nuclear warheads to communist Cuba.
- Cuba is only 90 miles away from the US.
- The missiles could have easily destroyed the southeastern states!



Soviet Ballistic Missile




Blockade

- US President John F. Kennedy ordered the US
 Navy to blockade Cuba, which prevented Soviet
 ships from delivering more weapons or supplies
 to the island.
- President Kennedy also sent troops to Florida in case the US needed to invade Cuba.
- He warned that any attack on the US from Cuba would be considered an act of war by the Soviet Union.

- After 13 tense days and many secret negotiations with Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev, the Soviets finally backed down and agreed to pull their missiles out of Cuba.
- The US also agreed to never invade Cuba again and to pull its own missiles out of Italy and Turkey.
- The world narrowly escaped a nuclear war!
- Fidel Castro, Cuba's dictator, was not present during the negotiations.
