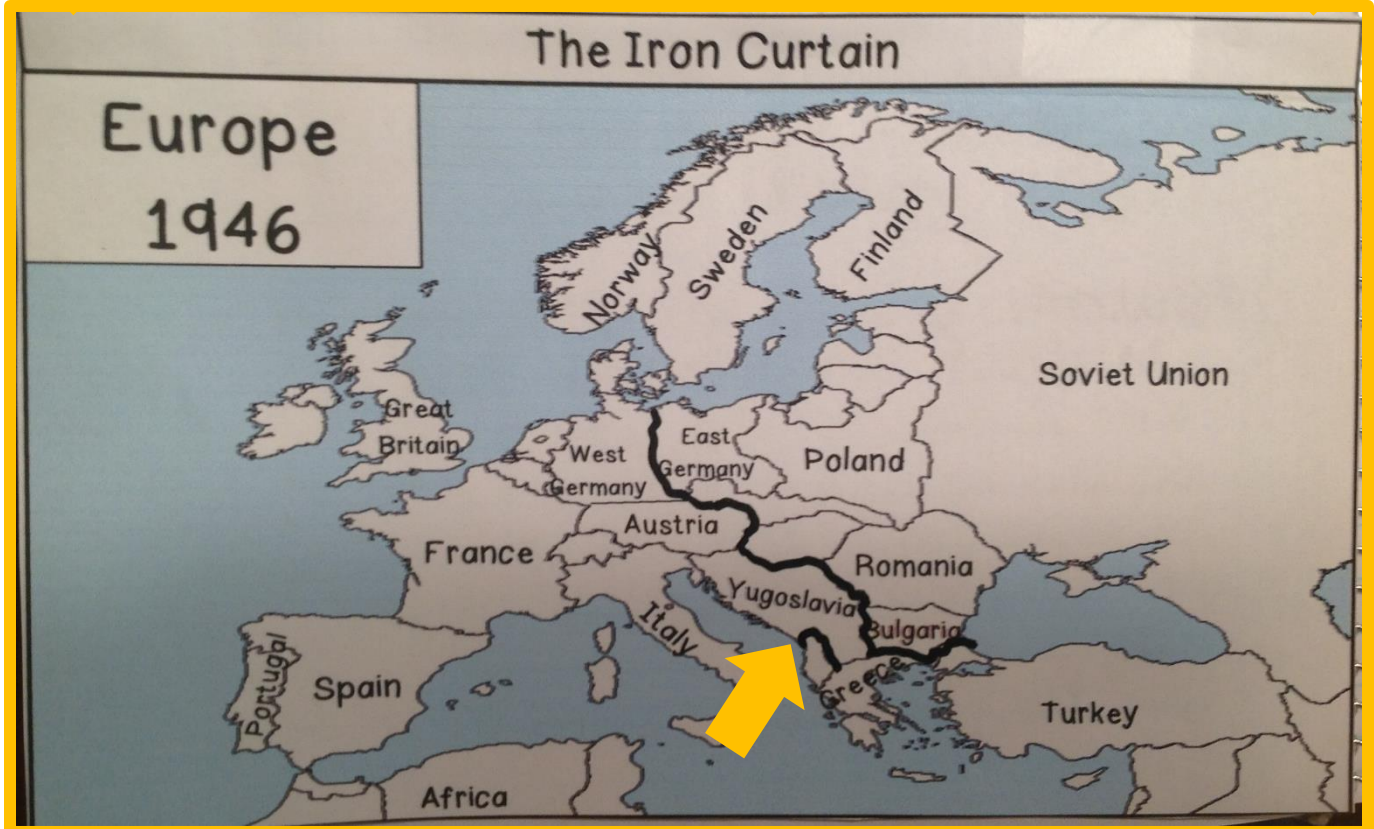


The Iron Curtain: Map of Europe in 1946

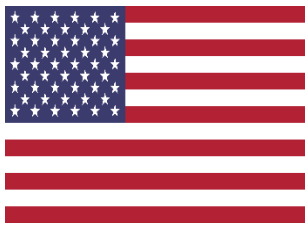

· Khrushchev supplied Cuba with nuclear missiles that they aimed at U.S.

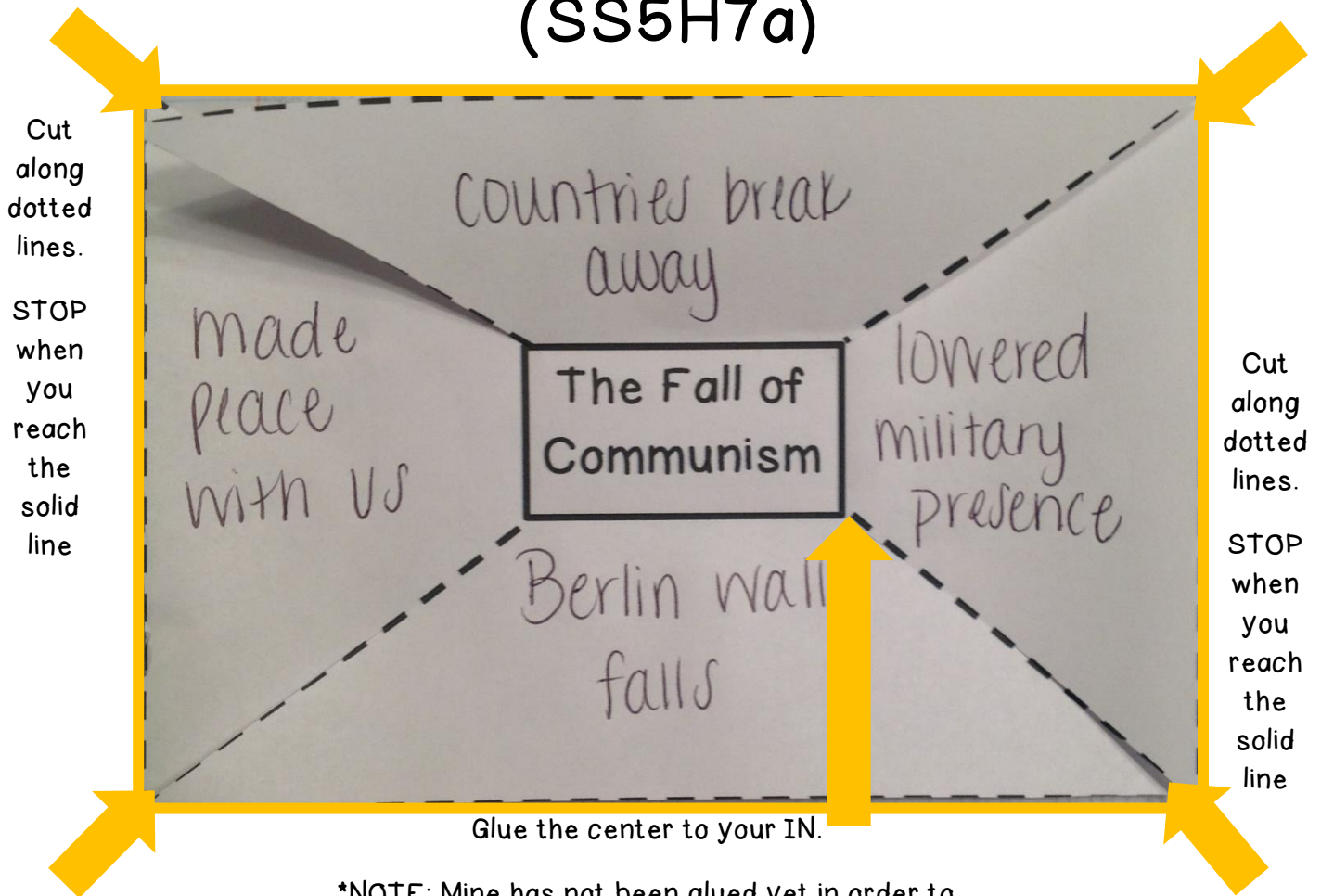
